#### **CORPORATE OVERVIEW**

Harvest Portfolios Group Inc. ("Harvest") is a Canadian Investment Manager focused on unique income generating investment products. Harvest was founded in 2009 by long term members of the investment management industry and is focused on developing investment products that follow the investment philosophy of:

- 1. Clear investment objectives
- 2. Transparency
- 3. Income generation

Harvest's mandate is to develop investment products that are clear in their mandate and easy for our investors to understand. We strive to be transparent, so that our investors can open their financial reports and know exactly what they own. Our funds are also invested to provide investors with consistent monthly or quarterly income; therefore, we seek to invest our fund portfolios in well managed companies that have a history of steady cash flow and pay dividends or distributions.

#### INVESTMENT PRODUCT

The Fund's investment objectives are to provide unitholders with quarterly cash distributions, the opportunity for capital appreciation and provide investors with exposure to select large capitalization U.S. companies that are leaders in terms of share repurchase programs or "buybacks". As part of the investment strategy, the Fund will invest in an equally-weighted portfolio of equity securities of the top 25 ranked US Buyback Leaders that have a market capitalization of at least US\$10 billion at the time of investment.



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Unitholder letter March 2016

Dear Valued Unitholder,

2015 can be characterized as a year of volatility in global markets. The continued and prolonged slump in commodity prices, in particular oil prices, put further pressure on economic growth in Canada. The lower oil prices have led to a lower dollar which will benefit exports, but has not currently translated into a rebound in manufacturing.

These macro factors will continue to impact our energy producing provinces, with Ontario, BC and Quebec maintaining moderate growth and therefore balancing overall national GDP. We do however expect the new Federal Liberal government to stimulate economic growth with a spending package as 2016 progresses.

Looking globally, many other nations are facing similar challenges due to slowing growth and lower commodity prices. Though the US Federal Reserve raised interest rates a quarter of a point in December we are of the opinion that further increases will be modest, if any at all during 2016, as world economic growth levels remain moderate. Japan and the European Union continue to provide fiscal stimulus and subsequently have lowered interest rates into negative territory.

The investment philosophy we have adhered to is, "if we don't understand it or can't value it, we won't buy it". With all the geo political and economic uncertainty in the world, we remain committed to our core guiding principles as set out below.

**Keep it Simple**: A complex product does not mean it is a better product. We want investors to understand exactly what they are investing in and are comfortable that it meets their objectives.

**Transparent**: A portfolio should reflect what an investor thought they were buying. Investors can check their statements and our website to verify and most importantly to "know what you own".

Consistent Income: All of our funds provide consistent monthly or quarterly income. We want to provide income from diverse sources.

In the latter half of 2015, we experienced turbulent markets and declines in value, but we know and are comfortable with what we own and are confident that returns will turn positive again. Investors who remain patient will see the benefits in the long term as evidenced by the strong bull market that emerged subsequent to the 2008 financial crisis.

I have personally and professionally experienced market declines as far back as 1987 and they always pose challenges and are difficult to navigate. Despite those challenges markets eventually rebounded. At Harvest we believe in our mandates in providing growth and income and we will continue to stay invested and own companies that are long term leaders in their respective industries.

Harvest continues to remain committed to its philosophy and we appreciate the confidence and patience you have placed in us by investing with us.

### MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

#### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGY

The Fund has been established to provide investors with exposure to select large capitalization U.S. companies that are leaders in terms of share repurchase programs or "buybacks". Share buybacks by an issuer (i) are often an indicator of successful companies that generate free cash flow, (ii) may indicate that management believes that the issuer's shares are undervalued or a good investment of the issuer's capital relative to other investment opportunities; (iii) are generally accretive to earnings per share; and (iv) provide additional liquidity and bid support to an issuer's shares in the market.

The Fund's investment objectives are to provide Unitholders with (i) the opportunity for capital appreciation; and (ii) quarterly cash distributions.

To achieve its investment objectives, the Fund invests in an equally-weighted Portfolio of Equity Securities of 25 US Buyback Leaders chosen from the US Buyback Leaders Investable Universe, being those issuers who have spent the most money to buy back their shares, as a percentage of their market capitalization.

The Manager will select the Equity Securities for the Portfolio and will quarterly reconstitute and rebalance the Portfolio such that the Portfolio, at the time of the initial investment and immediately following each quarterly reconstitution and rebalancing, will include an equal - weighting of the 25 issuers in the US Buyback Investable Universe with the highest Buyback Ratio.

#### **RISK**

The risks associated with investing in the Fund are as described in the prospectus. There were no material changes to the Fund over the period that affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

#### **RESULTS OF OPERATIONS**

The US Buyback Leaders Fund commenced operations following the closing of its initial public offering (IPO) March 25, 2015 for 5,000,000 Series A units at \$10.00 per unit for gross proceeds of \$50,000,000 and 311,500 Series U units at \$10.00 USD per unit for gross proceeds of \$3,115,000 USD. Performance information is not available for periods less than one year.

In general, buyback strategies have underperformed in the very short term with the S&P 500 Buyback Index returning -8.54% compared to the S&P 500 Index of -1.14% since March 25, 2015.

Equity market volatility picked up shortly after the Fund's launch as uncertainty surrounding Greek bailout negotiations sent European equities lower and rippled through equity markets around the world. This coupled with uncertainty and the anticipation and subsequent increase in the United States benchmark interest rate exacerbated the broader market volatility. Energy prices continued to be extraordinarily volatile through the end of year and also weighed on investor sentiment. In general, the strategy's limited exposure towards Utilities, Staples and Telecomm sectors, which tend to benefit when investors are seeking safety, dragged on the Fund's performance since inception.

The Fund listed for trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange under the ticker symbol of HUL.UN following the closing of its IPO. The Fund subsequently invested the net proceeds of the offering into 25 US Buyback Leaders in accordance with its investment objectives.



#### RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The Fund entered into a normal course issuer bid program for the period from May 4, 2015 to May 3, 2016, which allows the Fund to purchase up to 515,288 units of the Fund for cancellation by way of a normal course issuer bid through the facilities of the Toronto Stock Exchange and other Canadian markets. During the period ended December 31, 2015, 200,400 Series A units were purchased for cancellation for \$1,674,205.

#### RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

There were no related party transactions during the reporting period, except for management fees and other expense reimbursements paid to Harvest, as noted below in Management and Other Fees.

#### MANAGEMENT AND OTHER FEES

The Fund pays its manager, Harvest, a management fee calculated based on the average weekly net asset value ("NAV") and paid monthly in arrears, based on an annual rate of 0.75%, plus applicable taxes, of the NAV of the Fund.

At its sole discretion, the Manager may waive management fees or absorb expenses of the Fund. The management expense ratios of the Fund with and without the waivers and absorptions are reported in the Ratios and Supplemental Data table below.

#### Operating expenses

The Fund is responsible for operating expenses relating to the carrying on of its business, including custodial services, interest, taxes, legal, audit fees, transfer agency services relating to the issue and redemption of units, and the cost of financial and other reports, costs and expenses for the Fund's Independent Review Committee ("IRC"), including fees and expenses of the IRC members and compliance with applicable laws, regulations and policies. The Manager pays for such expenses on behalf of the Fund, except for certain expenses such as interest, and is then reimbursed by the Fund.

#### Other expenses

The Manager will be reimbursed by the Fund for all reasonable costs, expenses and liabilities incurred by the Manager for performance of services on behalf of the Fund in connection with the discharge by the Manager of its duties hereunder. Such costs and expenses may include, without limitation: mailing and printing expenses for reports to unitholders and other unitholder communications; a reasonable allocation of salaries, benefits and consulting fees; independent directors of the Manager and other administrative expenses and costs incurred in connection with the Fund's continuous public offering and other obligations. These expenses were \$69,709 for the period ended December 31, 2015 and are included in the unitholder reporting costs on the Statements of Comprehensive Income (Loss) in the annual financial statements.

During the Fund's initial offering, certain offering expenses such as costs of creating the Fund, the cost of printing and preparing the prospectus, legal expenses of the Fund and other out-of pocket expenses incurred by the agents together with the agent's fees payable by the Fund are included in the carrying amount of the Fund's obligation for net assets attributable to holders of redeemable units.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS OR REPORTS BY THE INDEPENDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Independent Review Committee tabled no special reports and made no extraordinary material recommendations to management of the Fund during the period ended December 31, 2015.

#### **Explanatory Notes:**

- 1. Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the reporting period. It is not intended that the Fund's net assets per unit table act as a continuity of opening and closing net assets per unit.
- 2. Net assets, at the commencement of operations on March 25, 2015 was \$9.33, net of agents' commissions and issuance costs of \$0.67 per unit for Series A and net assets, at the beginning of the period was \$11.66 (\$9.33 USD), net of agents' commissions and issuance costs of \$0.80 (\$0.67 USD) per unit for Series U.
- 3. Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional units of the Fund.
- 4. Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) of the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The MER for 2015 (the year of inception) the year of inception, included agents' fees of \$2,705,788 and issue costs of \$571,677 for Series A and agents' fees of \$204,626 and issue costs of \$44,184 for Series U, which were treated as a one-time expenses and therefore were not annualized. The MER without these costs is 1.47% for Series A and 1.47% for Series U.
- 5. The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.
- 6. The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund.

#### YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS

National Instument 81-106, the regulatory guideline for Continuous Disclosure, does not permit reporting of performance for any investment fund that has been in existence less than one year.
