CORPORATE OVERVIEW

Harvest Portfolios Group Inc. (“Harvest” or the “Manager”) is a Canadian Investment Manager founded in 2009. Harvest is focused on developing investment products that follow three investment criteria.

We (i) endeavor to develop investment products that are clear in their mandate and easy for investors to understand, (ii) strive to be transparent so that our investors can review their financial reports and know exactly what they own and (iii) seek to provide investors with consistent monthly or quarterly income by investing the fund portfolios in well managed companies that have a steady cash flow and dividend-paying history.

INVESTMENT PRODUCT

The Harvest US Bank Leaders Income ETF (the “Fund”) invests in an equally weighted portfolio of Equity Securities¹ of not less than 15 US Bank Leaders¹ and not more than 20 US Bank Leaders, chosen from the US Bank Leaders Investable Universe¹ that, immediately following each quarterly reconstitution, (i) have a market capitalization that is at least US\$10 billion as determined at the time of investment; (ii) are listed on a US stock exchange; and (iii) pay a dividend.

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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Unitholder letter March 2023

Dear Valued Investor,

Thank you for taking the time to read about Harvest ETFs & Funds in 2022 and our look ahead to 2023.

The past year reminded us of key lessons as investors, advisors, and fund managers. At Harvest Portfolios Group Inc., we were reminded of the importance of our core philosophy for wealth creation and preservation: own great businesses, hold them for the long-term, and generate steady income.

2022 saw central banks hiking key interest rates higher and faster than we, and many others, expected. These were among the highest and fastest rate increases in modern history, driven largely by central banks' goal to tame high and persistent inflation.

It was also a year of high volatility. Interest rate increases played a role, as did geopolitical instability and global economic uncertainty.

In an environment of persistent inflation, rising rates and high volatility, our focus on leading businesses and selling covered call options remained highly effective. Our Equity Income ETFs' defensive characteristics and ability to monetize volatility to generate high yields proved attractive in a turbulent year.

With bonds and equities both underperforming, the reliability of attractive income became a key component of total returns for many investors.

Even as investors have found success with our strategies, there is still a great deal of uncertainty around markets. The U.S. Federal Reserve claims they are trying to combat inflation without pushing the economy into recession. History shows that goal is very rarely achieved, but perhaps lightening up on the brakes early in 2023 could achieve the desired results.

We know that these rate increases will plateau at some point, and we believe we are nearing the end of that cycle. When that time comes, markets will react appropriately and likely move higher. We expect that 2023 will finish positive as rate hikes end and markets process these changes in the economy.

Markets are forward looking indicators, and the economic impact of rate increases are often delayed. This generally means markets recover and begin a growth trajectory before their underlying economies do.

As optimists and believers in the longer-term value of great businesses, we will continue to do what we always have at Harvest. We construct ETFs that hold solid businesses in their sector and use active & flexible covered call strategies to generate income where appropriate. We do that because we believe owning great businesses in the long-term is the best way to build and preserve wealth.

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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGY

The Fund has been created to provide investors with a unique exposure to a portfolio of Equity Securities that are primarily included in the Banks sector of the Global Industry Classification Standards¹ and (i) have a market capitalization that is at least US\$10 billion as determined at the time of investment; (ii) are listed on a US stock exchange; and (iii) pay a dividend.

The Fund's investment objectives are to provide unitholders with:

- (i) monthly cash distributions; and
- (ii) the opportunity for capital appreciation.

To achieve its investment objectives, the Fund will invest in an equally weighted portfolio of Equity Securities of not less than 15 US Bank Leaders and not more than 20 US Bank Leaders, chosen from the US Bank Leaders Investable Universe. In order to seek to generate additional returns, the Manager will sell call options on no more than 33% of the Equity Securities of each US Bank Leader held in the Fund. At the time of the initial investment and immediately following each quarter reconstitution, the Manager will review and give consideration to select investment characteristics that may include:

- Value** – Price-to-Earnings Ratio, Price-to-Book Value Ratio, Price-to-Cash Flow Ratio and Yield;
- Quality** – Return-on-Equity, Debt-to-Equity, Debt-to-Cash Flow Ratio and debt maturity profile; and
- Growth** – Long term earnings and dividend per share growth.

RISK

The risks associated with investing in the Fund are as described in the prospectus. There were no material changes to the Fund over the period that affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund returned -15.74% for Series A and -14.57% for Series U compared to the S&P 500 Banks Total Return Index (USD) of -19.21% for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Large cap bank stocks declined significantly during 2022. Despite an environment of rising interest rates and improving loan growth, which are both typically favorable for operating results at banks, investors became concerned that rapidly tightening financial conditions driven by hawkish monetary policy by the U.S. Federal Reserve would eventually lead to weakness in the industry. Diversified banks were generally notable laggards during the period due to their large capital markets-focused businesses. Deteriorating economic conditions during the period tended to weigh heavily on investment banking operations in general while increased market volatility led to more conservative than previously expected shareholder return plans as management teams focused on increasing capital levels to meet regulatory requirements. Regional banks, which tend to be more reliant on traditional borrowing and lending operations, generally performed better during the period as loan growth improved and higher rates broadly led to higher profit margins. The stocks in this group still tended to decline over the period amid rapidly rising mortgage rates that had a negative impact on mortgage lending operations and concerns surrounding tighter financial conditions and their impact on future loan activity.

The Fund outperformed its benchmark during the period, largely due to its higher exposure to smaller regional banks than the index, which has a higher allocation to large, diversified banks due to its market capitalization-based weighting scheme. In accordance with its investment mandate, the Fund is rebalanced to equal weight on a quarterly basis.

In accordance with its investment objectives, the Fund continued to employ an active covered call strategy in order to enhance the underlying dividend yield and meet its distribution requirements.

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RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The spread of the coronavirus (“COVID-19”) over the last couple of years has had a significant impact on the global economy. Although COVID-19 continues to exist, most countries have largely lifted COVID-19 related restrictions and the world has returned to a more normal level of activity. The lasting impact of COVID-19 has been significant supply chain issues which have begun to subside however persist in some industries, and a significant rise in inflation. Inflationary pressures have been exacerbated by the war in Ukraine and continue to impact global commodity supplies and costs. Central banks globally have quickly raised interest rates to address inflation although increasing the likelihood for a global recession. The above factors continue to impact global economies and financial markets, and uncertainty of the impact on financial performance of the Fund’s investments persists. The Fund’s future investment results may be materially adversely affected as a result.

In March 2023, banks within the sector have been impacted by liquidity and solvency concerns and the US government agencies assuming control or otherwise intervening in the operations of certain regional banks as a result. While these liquidity issues are currently isolated within specific regional banks, there is no certainty that these issues will not impact other banks. The ultimate resolution of these liquidity and solvency concerns and the extent of the related impact to the Fund is uncertain and could be significant.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

There were no related party transactions during the reporting period, except for management fees and other expense reimbursements paid to Harvest, as noted below in Management and Other Fees.

MANAGEMENT AND OTHER FEES

The Manager is responsible for managing the Fund’s overall business and operations and provides key management personnel to the Fund. The Fund pays the Manager an annual management fee of 0.75%, plus applicable taxes, based on a percentage of the average daily net asset value (“NAV”) of the Fund.

Operating expenses

The Fund is responsible for operating expenses relating to the carrying on of its business, including custodial services, interest, taxes, legal, audit fees, transfer agency services relating to the issue and redemption of units, and the cost of financial and other reports, costs and expenses for the Fund’s Independent Review Committee (“IRC”), including fees and expenses of the IRC members and compliance with applicable laws, regulations and policies. The Manager pays for such expenses on behalf of the Fund, except for certain expenses such as interest, and is then reimbursed by the Fund.

Other expenses

The Manager will be reimbursed by the Fund for all reasonable costs, expenses and liabilities incurred by the Manager for performance of services on behalf of the Fund in connection with the discharge by the Manager of its duties hereunder. Such costs and expenses may include, without limitation: mailing and printing expenses for reports to unitholders and other unitholder communications; a reasonable allocation of salaries and benefits; and other administrative expenses and costs incurred in connection with the Fund’s continuous public offering and other obligations. These expenses are allocated by the Manager on a reasonable basis, across all the Harvest Portfolios Group Inc. funds, and series of each applicable fund. These expenses were \$17,722 for the year ended December 31, 2022 (2021 - \$14,272) and are included in the unitholder reporting costs on the Statements of Comprehensive Income (Loss) in the financial statements.

Waivers and absorptions

At its sole discretion, the Manager may waive management fees or absorb expenses of the Fund. There were no management fee waivers for the year ended December 31, 2022 or 2021. The Manager absorbed \$88,359 of expenses of the Fund for the year ended December 31, 2022 (2021 - \$103,968). The Manager may cease doing so at any time without notice to unitholders. The management expense ratios of the Fund with and without the waivers and absorptions are reported in the Ratios and Supplemental Data table below.

RECOMMENDATIONS OR REPORTS BY THE INDEPENDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Independent Review Committee tabled no special reports and made no extraordinary material recommendations to management of the Fund during the year ended December 31, 2022.

Explanatory Notes:

- Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the reporting period. It is not intended that the Fund's net assets per unit table act as a continuity of opening and closing net assets per unit.
- Net assets, at the commencement of operations on January 31, 2018 was \$20.00 for Series A and \$20.00 USD for Series U.
- Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional units of the Fund. The Fund may pay additional year end distributions in the form of reinvested units that are subsequently consolidated. There is no impact on NAV per unit, however such reinvested distributions increase the cost base of units held. Included in the above amounts is the reinvested distribution of \$0.25 per unit paid to Series A unitholders of record on December 31, 2021.
- Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) of the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period.
- The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. In 2020 the calculation was modified to include certain transaction costs charged by the custodian. The trading expense ratio in prior periods was not re-stated.
- The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund.
- The USD amount of the net assets at the end of the period was \$14.58 USD.

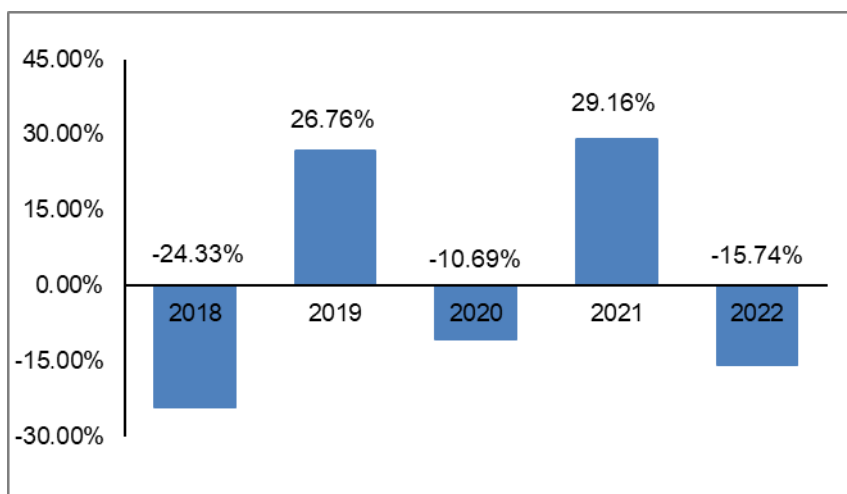

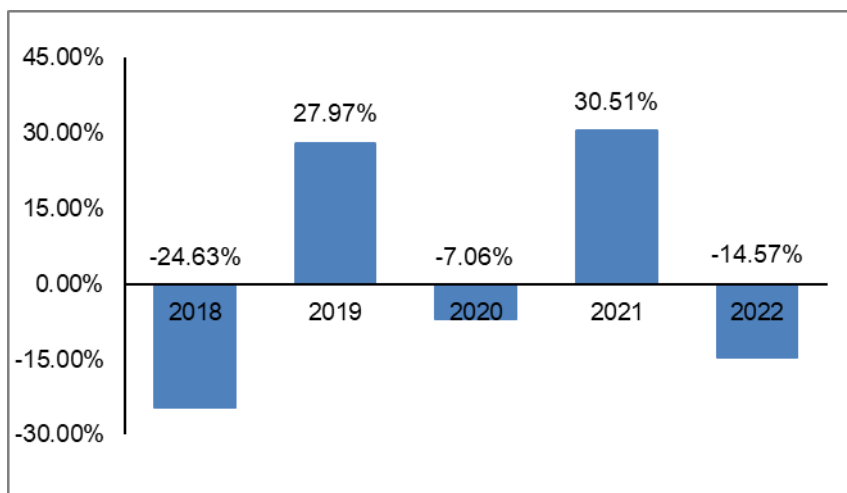
Fund Performance

For comparison purposes the S&P 500 Banks Total Return Index, in U.S. dollars (the “Index”) is used. While the Fund uses this benchmark for long-term performance comparisons, it is not managed relative to the composition of the Index. As a result, the Fund may experience periods when its performance is not aligned with the Index, either positively or negatively. The return of the Index is calculated without the deduction of management fees and fund expenses whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
